


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INTRODUCTION

This manual contains Instructions for installing the **MAXON MOBILITY** Wheelchair Lift in a transit vehicle. Please follow these instructions carefully and call us immediately if you need assistance with the installation. Do not take shortcuts, skip over installation steps, or modify the Lift. Correct installation is important to ensure the Lift operates correctly. If you have questions that are not covered in this manual, please contact:

After receiving the Wheelchair Lift, unpack the Lift and check it for freight damage. For freight-damaged items, immediately submit a claim to the carrier.

Make sure Installation Kit contains all items on the Packing List shipped with the kit. Please report any missing items immediately to our **Customer Service Department**. The **Warranty Registration Card**, shipped with the Lift, must be completed and returned to **Maxon Lift Corp.** within 30 days after installation and/or receipt of the Lift.


A WARNING

- 1. Read and understand the instructions in this **Installation Manual** before installing Lift.
- 2. Before operating the Lift, read and understand the operating instructions contained in the Operator's Manual.
- **3.** Comply with all **WARNING** and instruction decals attached to the Lift and those same instructions and **WARNINGS** attached to vehicle.
- 4. Keep decals clean and legible. If decals are unreadable or missing, free replacement decals are available from MAXON Lift Corp. Customer Service. Refer to DECALS & DECAL PLACEMENT and the instructions for installing decals on vehicle, in this manual.
- **5.** Consider the safety and location of bystanders and location of nearby objects when operating the Lift. Stand to one side of platform while operating the Lift.
- **6.** Do not allow untrained persons to operate the Lift.
- 7. Do not stand under, or allow obstructions under the Platform when lowering the Lift. Be sure your feet are clear of the Lift.
- 8. Keep fingers, hands, arms, legs, and feet clear of moving Lift parts (and platform edges) when operating this Lift.
- 9. Make sure vehicle battery power is disconnected when installing Lift. Connect vehicle power to the Lift only when instructed to connect power.

- **10.** Wear appropriate safety equipment, such as protective eyeglasses, faceshield and clothing when installing the Lift and handling the vehicle battery. Prevent injuries by protecting your eyes and exposed skin.
- 11. Be careful working by a vehicle battery. Make sure the work area is well ventilated and there are no flames or sparks near the battery. Never lay objects on the battery that can short the terminals together. If battery acid gets in your eyes, immediately seek first aid. If acid gets on your skin, immediately wash it off with soap and water.
- **12.** If an emergency situation arises (vehicle or Lift) while operating the Lift, release the hand control switch and the Lift will stop.
- 13. A correctly installed Lift operates smoothly and reasonably quiet. The only noticeable noise, during Lift operation, is from the Pump Unit while the Platform is raised and folded. Listen for scraping, grating and binding noises and correct the problem before continuing to operate the Lift.

VEHICLE REQUIREMENTS

The minimum vehicle requirements for installing the WL7 Wheelchair Lift are described below. Installing the Lift in accordance with the vehicle requirements and the instructions in this manual will result in an installation that is compliant with Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard (FMVSS) 403 and FMVSS 404.

FORCE & MOMENT PRODUCED BY LIFT ON VEHICLE FLOOR FIG. 6-1




Consult body manufacturer for body strength data. Make sure the forces created by the Lift are within the limits prescribed by body manufacturer.

NOTE: The Lift represents approximately 400 lbs. of "F" shown in the illustration.


The WL7 Lift must be bolted to the vehicle body. Body must withstand the maximum vertical force ("F") and moment of force ("M") (FIG. 6-1) produced by the Lift on the vehicle floor surface shown in FIGS. 6-2, 6-3, and 6-4.

ELECTRICAL POWER

Vehicle must have a 12 volts dc electrical system capable of supplying 65 amperes of electrical power to the Lift for each operating cycle.

SAFETY INTERLOCK SYSTEM

Vehicle must have an FMVSS 403 compliant, onboard Safety Interlock System that interfaces with the Wheel-chair Lift interlock signal. Interlock signal may be V+ or V-. The interlock system on a host Vehicle must:

- Prevent the Lift from being unstowed when Vehicle is in drive or reverse.
- Prevent the Vehicle from moving when the Lift is unstowed.
- Prevent the Lift from disabling Vehicle, if the Lift signals an unstowed condition when the Vehicle is moving.

For the applicable Interlock electrical connections on the Lift, refer to the Electrical System Diagram in this manual. For more information about the interlock connections call:







LIFT COMPONENTS & TERMINOLOGY



LIFT COMPONENTS (SEE TABLE 13-1) FIG. 12-1

ITEM	NAME	DESCRIPTION
1.	THRESHOLD PLATE	Component that bridges the entry way, through the Lift, into the vehicle. Detects if that portion of Lift is occupied during "UP/DOWN" operation between vehicle floor and the ground.
2.	OUTBOARD ROLLSTOP	Barrier to prevent the Wheelchair from rolling off of the Platform. Also provides entry/exit ramp for Platform on the ground.
3.	PLATFORM	Contains the Wheelchair and Occupant during "UP/DOWN" operation between vehicle floor and the ground.
4.	HANDRAILS	(Left/Right) Provides a hand hold for the Lift Occupant.
5.	INBOARD ROLLSTOP	Barrier to prevent the Wheelchair from rolling off inboard side of Platform. Also, provides bridge between Platform and Threshold.
6.	HYDRAULIC CYLINDER	(Left/Right) Telescoping steel tube and rod, pressurized by hydraulic fluid, that folds and unfolds the Lift and moves the Lift up and down.
7.	HYDRAULIC POWER UNIT (COVER IS SHOWN)	Contains motorized hydraulic pump, manually operated backup pump, fluid lines, and controls to operate the hydraulic cylinders.
8.	LIFT CONTROLLER	Electronic device that controls and monitors Lift operation and the interlock connection with the vehicle.
9.	BASE	Structure that secures Lift to the vehicle floor.
10.	THRESHOLD WARNING BEACON	Flashing red light indicates Threshold is occupied by a person or object when the Platform is below floor level. Also indicates Outboard Rollstop is open if Platform is at floor level.
11.	THRESHOLD WARNING ALARM	Audible alarm sounds when Threshold is occupied by a person or object when the Platform is below floor level. Also indicates Outboard Rollstop is open if Platform is at floor level.
12.	PLATFORM LIGHTS	Illuminates the Platform when ready to load at floor level and during "UP/DOWN" operation between vehicle floor and the ground.







ANTI-SLIP & SAFETY STRIPING - Continued (34" WIDE PLATFORM)



LIFT INSTALLATION

INSTALLATION KIT

An installation kit is required to install Lift on your Vehicle. Refer to the Instruction Sheet, included with the Installation Kit, for specific instructions to fit the Lift to your Vehicle.

PREPARING AND POSITIONING THE LIFT


1. Make sure you have the correct model of Lift.


NOTE: Keep shipping straps on the Lift until Lift is bolted to Vehicle and power is connected.

2. Unpack the Lift and check for damage. Report damage to:

- 3. Open the Wheelchair door on vehicle (FIG. 19-1) in which Lift will be mounted. Secure the door wide open.
- 4. Check the Clearance Dimensions of your Vehicle before beginning installation. Refer to VEHICLE REQUIREMENTS section in this Installation Manual.
- **5.** Using an appropriate lifting device that can safely lift 500 pounds, raise Lift to the Wheelchair doorway. Place the Lift inside doorway (FIG. 19-2). Align outboard edge of Lift Threshold Plate parallel with outboard edge of doorway. The decal on the underside of the Lift platform must face outboard (FIG. 19-2).
- 6. Position the Lift according to the clearance dimensions given in VEHICLE **REQUIREMENTS** section in this Installation Manual.
- 7. Remove lifting device. Then close Wheelchair Door. Enter the vehicle and check if the Wheelchair Door is closed correctly and if there is sufficient clearance. If door will not close correctly. reposition the Lift back enough to close the door and keep the minimum 3/4" clearance.
- **8.** Secure vehicle door wide open (FIG. 19-1).






PREPARING AND POSITIONING THE LIFT - Continued

9. Check under the vehicle floor for possible interference between the Lift Base Plate mounting bolts and the vehicle underbody such as subframe members, wiring harnesses, cables, and fluid lines.

MOUNTING THE LIFT

NOTE: MAXON recommends using all 10 carriage screws (Kit items) to bolt Lift to Vehicle. At least 8 screws or bolts and use of holes 1, 2, 3, 4 & 9 are required for correct installation. Also, the front 3 holes should be selected to give a symmetrical bolt pattern (i.e. holes 5,10, & 8 or holes 6,10, & 7).

 Use the Base Plate (FIG. 20-1, holes 1-10) to mark eight (8) to ten (10) 7/16" mounting holes through the vehicle floor. Drill holes 1, 2, 9, 3, and 4 now. Before drilling holes in the vehicle floor, make sure no wires and fluid lines are too close to hole locations.



NOTE: Vehicle floor must meet the requirements shown at the beginning of the **VEHICLE REQUIREMENTS** section in this Installation Manual.

- 2. Position Lift so holes 1-10 in the Base Plate (FIG. 20-1) are aligned with the correct holes, drilled in vehicle floor.
- 3. Temporarily secure Lift to Vehicle with two mounting bolts (Kit items), inserted through Base Plate holes 1 and 4, or holes 2 and 3 (FIG. 20-1). Use two lock nuts and correct under-vehicle supports (Kit items) to secure the Lift. Use instructions supplied with your Vehicles Installation Kit to select the correct bolts, nuts and supports. Alternately, tighten the two bolts and nuts to 20 to 30 LBS.-FT.


INSTALL MAIN CIRCUIT BREAKER

A WARNING

To prevent personal injury and equipment damage, make sure power is disconnected from Liftgate while installing electrical parts.

NOTE: Apply dielectric grease on all electrical connections after all electrical cables are connected.


1. Unbolt & remove Pump Cover (FIG. 21-1).

2. Attach 90 Amp Main Circuit Breaker (Kit item) to Vehicle so Power Cable (Kit item) is within reach of the battery, as follows. Find a place to attach Bracket (FIG. 22-1). (Consider that the Power Cable must reach between 90 Amp Circuit Breaker and (+) battery terminal without straining the connections.) Attach 90 Amp Circuit Breaker to Bracket. Then attach Bracket to Vehicle with four (4) #12 selfdrilling screws (Kit items).


- **3.** Connect one end of Power Cable to 90 Amp Main Circuit Breaker (**FIG. 22-1**). Keep battery end disconnected until instructed to connect to the battery.
- 4. Next connect one end of long Power Cable to 90 Amp Main Circuit Breaker (FIG. 22-1). Then go on to the next page for instructions on routing the Power Cable to the Lift.

A CAUTION


Never route an energized wire. Make sure the battery is disconnected. Always route electrical wire clear of any moving parts, brake lines, sharp edges, and exhaust systems. Never route power cable next to a wiring harness on the vehicle. Do not loop excess cable. Cut the cable to fit, and leave slack. Attach securely. If drilling is necessary, be sure to check underside of vehicle before drilling so you do not damage any fuel lines, vent lines, brake lines or wires. When routing electrical wire through a hole in vehicle floor, use supplied grommet to protect wires from chafing.

1. Locate and drill a 1-5/16" hole through the vehicle floor (FIG. 23-1). Drill the hole in a location that will be hidden by the Pump Cover and that will allow Power Cable to be routed to Starter Solenoid #2 (FIG. 23-1). Since the Interlock System wiring from the Lift also branches out in that area, locate the hole so the 3-conductor Interlock system cable can be routed from the Lift, through the vehicle floor, to the Vehicle Safety Interlock. Install the plastic grommet (FIG. 23-1) on the vehicle floor with 2 of the #12 self-drilling screws.



2. Route the long Power Cable (Kit item) from Main Circuit Breaker (FIG. 23-2), underneath Vehicle floor, and then to Starter Solenoid (S.S. 2)(FIG. 23-1).


3. Secure power cable every 8"-10". Bind the power cable to the Pump wiring or Mounting Plate using cable ties.

- 5. Route the Interlock Cable from Safety Interlock System on the Vehicle, underneath Vehicle Floor, through grommet, and up to the Lift (FIG. 24-2). If possible, use the same cable routing as the long Power Cable installed in previous steps. Secure the Interlock Cable every 8"-10".
- 6. Make sure Interlock Cable will reach the White-Red Stripe wire (Interlock Signal from Vehicle) and the Brown wire (Interlock Signal to Vehicle) on the Lift (FIG. 24-2). Signal may be ground or V+. Connect the Interlock wires from the Vehicle Interlock System to the White-Red Stripe wire and Brown wire on the Lift (FIG. 24-2).




7. Uncoil the Ground Cable. Route the Ground Cable on the Lift through grommet in Vehicle floor (FIG. 25-1).




GROUND CABLE ROUTED FROM LIFT

NOTE: Clean the ground cable connection point, on the frame, down to bare metal.

NOTE: Apply dielectric grease to all electrical connections.

- 8. Extend the Ground Cable to reach Vehicle frame (FIG. 25-2). Drill a 13/32" (0.406") hole in Vehicle frame for bolting the Ground Cable terminal lug (FIG. 25-2).
- 9. Bolt the Ground Cable terminal lug to Vehicle frame with correct 3/8"-16 cap screw, lock washer, and hex nut from Kit (FIG. 25-2).



BOLTING GROUND CABLE TO VEHICLE FRAME FIG. 25-2




A CAUTION

To prevent vehicle access door from pinching and damaging the Hand Control cable, secure cable away from the door frame. Also, be sure that the hand control cable does not interfere with or bind against moving parts.


10. Connect the Hand Control cable as follows (FIG. 26-1). Move the Protective Sleeve to expose connector (FIGS. 26-1 and 26-2). Unlock the Locking Tab (FIG. 26-2). Then press Latch (FIG. 26-2) and plug in the connector (RH or LH side of Lift) (FIG. 26-1). Lock the Locking Tab (FIG. 26-3).



CONNECTING HAND CONTROL CABLE (RH SIDE CONNECTION SHOWN) FIG. 26-1




CONNECTOR WITH UNLOCKED TAB FIG. 26-2

11. Find accessible place on Vehicle wall or Wheelchair Door (near Lift) to place the Hand Control Hanger and Cable Hook (FIG. 27-1)). Use the Hanger as a template to mark and drill 2 holes for #12 self-tapping screws. Secure the Hanger to Vehicle with 2 of the #12 self-tapping screws (Parts Box HAND CONTROL items). Mark and drill a & HANGER hole for #10 self-tapping screw. Then secure **CABLE HOOK** Cable Hook to Vehicle with #10 self-tapping


screw (Parts Box item).




TYPICAL LOCATION (INSIDE VEHICLE) FOR STOWING HAND CONTROL. FIG. 27-1

12. Place decals (from Parts Box) on the Vehicle, near the Hand Control (typical placement shown in FIG. 28-1). Make sure decals are visible to operator when Lift is being operated.




DECALS AND HAND CONTROL MOUNTING ON VEHICLE FIG. 28-1



CONNECTING POWER TO LIFT (TYPICAL) FIG. 29-1


14. Turn ON power ON/OFF switch on Pump Cover to power the Lift (FIG. 29-2). Ensure switch illuminates when power is ON. Briefly press the FOLD button on Hand Control to pressurize hydraulic system. Remove remaining shipping straps.




STOWED LIFT - LH SIDE SHOWN FIG. 29-2

15. Press the UNFOLD button on Hand Control to unfold Lift (FIG. 30-1). Platform lights will turn on when Platform is at floor level.



16. Next press DOWN button on Hand Control. When the Platform reaches the ground, the Outboard Rollstop will automatically open to ramp position (FIG. 30-2).



17. Install the remaining bolts, lock nuts, and under-vehicle supports supplied with your Installation Kit. Use the Instruction Sheet (Kit item) for information to install the remaining Kit items correctly.

NOTE: Lift installation is not complete until all the instructions in this manual, your Installation Kit instructions, and the checks and adjustments that follow (in this manual) are completed.

CHECKING HYDRAULIC FLUID LEVEL

CAUTION


Keep dirt, water and other contaminants from entering the hydraulic system. Before opening the hydraulic fluid reservoir filler cap, drain plug and hydraulic lines, wipe off contaminants that can get in the openings. Also, protect the openings from accidental contamination.

- 1. Check the Hydraulic Fluid level in Reservoir as follows. With Liftgate stowed, fluid level should be as shown in **FIG. 31-1**.
- 2. If needed, add fluid to the Reservoir as follows. Pull out (no threads) Filler Cap (FIG. 31-1). Fill the Reservoir with Hydraulic Fluid (TABLE 31-1) to level shown in FIG. 31-1. Reinstall Filler Cap (FIG. 31-1).



- 1. Make sure power switch (FIG. 32-1A) is turned on and illuminated. Lower Lift to the ground (FIG. 32-1A).

- 3. Set edge of the Threshold Plate to 5/8" height by turning the adjustment screw on the RH Side of Threshold plate (FIG. 32-2B). Turn adjustment screw counterclockwise (FIG. 32-3) to raise Threshold Plate or clockwise to lower. Repeat for LH Side of Threshold Plate. Alternately measure height (see step 2) and turn the adjustment screw on RH Side and LH Side until the entire edge of Threshold plate is at the 5/8" height.




1-1/2 TURN CCW - ALARM & BEACONS TURN OFF





NOTE: The platform tilt adjustment is important for operation of the Outboard Rollstop and for keeping Platform level when it reaches the ground. Vehicle floor height, Lift installation angle, and stiffness of the Vehicle suspension may change the angle of Platform on the ground.


 Make sure power switch (FIG. 34-1) is turned on and illuminated. Lower the Platform and stop approximately 4" above ground.



- Measure distance from front of the Platform (1) to the ground (FIG. 34-2). Next measure the distance from the bottom of the Vertical Arm (2) to the ground (FIG. 34-2).
- 3. The measurement at the Vertical Arm (2) must be 1/2" -1" higher than the measurement at the front of Platform (1). For example: If you measure 4" at the front (1), then you should measure from 4-1/2" to 5" at the Vertical Arm (2). If there is not a 1/2" 1" difference, do instruction 4 to get the correct measurement.



4. To ensure proper leveling, turn PLATFORM TILT adjustment screws (FIG. 35-1) an equal amount, on both sides of Platform. Turn adjustment screws clockwise (FIG. 35-2) to tilt the Platform up or counterclockwise to tilt Platform down.

SYSTEM DIAGRAMS HYDRAULIC SYSTEM DIAGRAM



ELECTRICAL SYSTEM DIAGRAM


